Bible Studies

The Wednesday evening Bible study group is engaged in a year-long overview of the Bible, using a curriculum titled "Discovering the Bible." This method is produced by the *Kerygma* program (Kerygma is a Greek word which means "the message"), and is a basic

way of looking at themes which occur throughout the Bible, encompassing the Old Testament, New Testament, and the Apocrypha.

Another opportunity for a **daytime**, **short-term study of Scripture** will take place during Lent (which begins on Ash Wednesday, March 9). Stay tuned for further information! A sign-up sheet will be posted on the bulletin board.

Are you sure you're really a member of All Saints'?

Often, persons think that regular attendance at a church is sufficient to make them members. Not so in the Episcopal Church, which tracks her members very carefully, recalling Jesus' prayer to his Father "that not one of them be lost." In order to be officially a member of All Saints', all that is required is that you register the date and place of your Baptism with us; that information will be entered into the Parish Register. (For reporting purposes, it would be helpful if you could do that by January 1.) You may also ask for your Letter of Transfer to be sent from another Episcopal church, or become an Episcopalian through Confirmation (for those coming to the church from a Protestant tradition) or by being Received into the Episcopal Church (for those coming from the Roman Catholic or Eastern Orthodox traditions). If you or yours is interested in becoming a member of All Saints', please speak to Mother Davidson. An Inquirer's Class will be forming soon for those who desire Confirmation or Reception into the Episcopal Church, as well as for those who would like a "refresher" on the Episcopal Church.

The Annual Meeting of All Saints' Episcopal Church will take place on Sunday, January 23, immediately following the Sunday Eucharist, and be followed by a potluck lunch (the sign-up sheet from the earlier planned potluck remains in effect!). The agenda of the Annual Meeting includes the election of three new Vestry members to succeed those who are retiring: Brad Renner, Bill Rinkavage, and Red Smith. We are grateful to them for their ministry! (Note: Red Smith will remain in the office of Treasurer, though his Vestry rotation expires.) Vestry members are elected to serve three-year terms, renewable after one year intervals (Canon I.7; Parish By-Law 1). By Canon, those eligible to vote in the Annual Meeting are Confirmed adult communicants aged 16 and over who for the past six months have been "faithful in attendance at the services of the Church unless for good cause prevented, faithful contributors to its support, and faithful in working, praying and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God." (Canon I.6) In order to be eligible for nomination, persons must be members of the parish at least 18 years of age, in accord with the above requirements.

A suggested resolution for the New Year (consider it a New Year's gift to your family): Plan your funeral! A rubric in the Book of Common Prayer (p. 445, at the end of the service of Thanksgiving for the Birth or Adoption of a Child) reminds us that part of our duty as Christians is to be good stewards of all our resources, including our bodies; prepare a will (while you are in good health!) including a bequest to your church, if you are able; assign advance directives for a time when you are unable to make decisions for yourself – a "living will," power of attorney, and medical power of attorney; and sit down with your priest to plan the details of your own funeral service, with copies of all of

these documents distributed, as appropriate, among your next of kin, your attorney, your doctor and your priest. It will be a tremendous gift to your family, who will then not be forced to make important decisions in haste, in a time of crisis.

Church School

Activities for the journey of confirmation, regional Lock down Retreat for the Middle school students is being planned for February 4, 2011at All Saints Church. Regional Family and Youth Eucharist Workshop Hosted by Saint Paul's in Woodbury. This is a day activity for families hearing and participating in the first Eucharist with hands on activities for adults and youth.
